5. PUBLIC COMMENTS (Agenda Items Only)

Mr. Bilker asked the community members who wanted to speak if they would like to speak now or wait until the end of the meeting.

Community member ~ Thank you for letting me speak. Just wanted to be a voice for choice. I think we all have really suffered this year in many ways and each of us in our personal way and can't understand how it has been for someone else. We have all had our challenges. Some of us have had mental health issues, some have had physical health issues, so I am happy that we are in person again and we are one step closer to real normal. I am so grateful for that. I want you to know that I am a proud American, I love what our country stands for which is freedom. We are supposed to be a melting pot. We are supposed to be able to go to whatever church we want or not. We are supposed to embrace our differences and respect them. This year as Americans we were asked to think of how we treat people of color and how we can embrace our differences and create equal space. My concern is with the pandemic we have use shaming and judging people about making medical decisions. Medical decisions are personal, just like religion, and not everyone can understand, because we grow up different and have different experiences. Example, are any of you allergic to peanut butter, bee stings, shellfish, penicillin? My point is you don't know what can harm my body and I don't know what can harm your body. This is not a one size fits all. We can say everyone should do this or everyone should do that, but in no situation is that really true. You have to account for the differences between us and that has to be respected and I am saying as a parent in this school district, and I am speaking for many, many other parents and many children, that we are given a choice on how our children attend school. We are happy to be back in person full day, but I don't think people like masks. I know a lot of people that wear mask and I am not judging them, I don't think my family should be forced to wear a mask and I don't think that my family should be forced to get a vaccine that could harm our bodies, especially if there are medical issues. Other people are free to get vaccines and make that choice for themselves. We would like you to uphold as Americans that we have the ability to make decisions without being judged. Thank you.

Community member ~ The emergency order is coming to an end on May 31st. I am here to have it on record to ask you to stop making medical decisions for our children and leave those decisions up to the parents. I can't believe that we are living in a time when parents are getting messages from school board members that you are forming a strong partnership with pharmacy's who are literally conducting non FDS approved experiments on our children and this is somehow being excepted. What is happening here? If you are no familiar with the Nierenberg code, I suggest you look into it before continuing to make medical decisions for our children. Crimes against humanity is kind of a big deal. You have not provided us with any scientific evidence that harm will not be done to our children as a result of wearing a mask all day at school, yet I can provide you with endless amounts of information that harm has already happened and will continue to happen if you can't unmask our children. In fact, according to the Child Protective Service law covering up their mouths and face is a form of child abuse. On the same note, forcing a healthy child to act as if they need to protect others from a deadly virus, all day long that, they don't have to begin with is called mental Munchausen syndrome by proxy. I have respected your decision and kept my daughters at home for over a year now and I am done playing games with all of you. As I sat and looked at all the pictures on social media of the Marple Newtown athletes out playing their games, representing Marple Newtown, they are smiling, hugging, and being together, most importantly they have happy mask less faces. Children are enjoying life and doing children should be doing mask less. Let it be clear I have nothing against athletes, my 6th grade daughter is a PA state Junior Olympic gymnast who has not stopped training or competing this entire year and has done it all mask less. However, I have to be honest, every time I see those pictures of those kids from Marple everything looks back to

normal, my heart breaks for my 8th grade daughter as she sits in her room everyday staring at a black screen all day long and doesn't have the opportunity to have those kinds of relationships and get to be a part of any of the school teams because she is at home following your rules. She was a student who received honor roll every semester and now I get constant emails from her teachers and guidance counselor that she is failing every class. A child who has never had a bad day at school, a child who loves Paxon Hollow Middle School, she loves her teachers, she loves her friends, her locker and just being inside her school. Her life has changed tremendously because of your uninformative medical opinions have forced her to live for the last 14 months. You have discriminated against our religion and our medical beliefs and I am asking you for the last time, on the record, to please do what is right thing and stop before you do anymore damage. You have had the power all along to listen to the other thousands of medical experts that are against masking of children, why do you refuse to listen to those people. If it is not in the child's best mental, physical, and educational interest to continue this masking standard and I ask you to vote to end the mask wearing when the emergency order ends on May 31st and to let all of our children get their normal lives back. We need to heal and move on. Several districts in PA has made mask and experimental vaccines optional because they recognize that it is a parent's rights only to make medical decisions for their children. If other districts can do this so can Marple Newtown. It is time to support all parents and all children and have masks be optional. Give us the medical freedom to choose what is best for our own children, medical choice options far out way the risk. Thank you.
